#### **Pupils**

The school has items of uniform which all parents are encouraged to buy \*. The school also requests at admission that all parents support our desire to see all pupils wearing uniform and looking smart. A full list of items required is available from the office but the basic school day expectation is that pupils will wear:-

- A CHS sweatshirt
- A CHS polo-shirt (optional) or a plain shirt with a collar
- Grey or black school trousers (no denims, cords or tracksuits)
- Shoes or trainers (preferably black)

As a staff we take a pride in how smartly our pupils are presented. We ask all parents to support us fully in this area.

#### Staff

Whilst we are not prescriptive all staff are encouraged to be smartly and appropriately dressed. This is to reflect the emphasis we place on providing pupils with excellent role models.

- In the school day, jeans and shorts are not considered appropriate.
- Appropriate clothing for PE is expected.
- Shorts are not appropriate clothing, unless for an activity agreed by the Headteacher.
- Appropriate footwear should be worn at all times.

It is assumed that the level of professional pride Cicely Haughton School staff have of themselves will achieve the above.

General: Chewing gum is not appropriate for staff or pupils.

\* Where there are very genuine reasons for parents being unable to afford an item of clothing, the school will try to help by providing uniform.
